CMS assigns star ratings to U.S. hospitals annually based on 46 hospital quality measures. These are divided into five quality categories: safety of care, mortality, patient experience, readmission rates, and timely and effective care. Data reporting periods range from July 2018 to March 2022, depending on the measure.

LOGANSPORT MEMORIAL HOSPITAL EARNS 5-STAR CMS RATING FOR OVERALL HOSPITAL QUALITY

Logansport Memorial Hospital (LMH) is pleased to have earned a 5-star rating in patient experience in the latest round of Overall Hospital Quality Star Ratings released by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).

The 5-star rating is the highest overall hospital rating given by CMS. This rating is measured on five quality metrics which include patient outcomes such as mortality, safety of care, readmission, timely and effective care, and patient experience. Examples of measures that factor into the 5-star rating include the rate of readmission for heart failure patients and the percentage of patients who received appropriate care for severe sepsis shock. Patient experience is based on data collected from randomized phone surveys following patient stays at the hospital. The star ratings program is designed to increase healthcare transparency and to help patients and their family members make informed decisions about where to go for the care they need.

LMH's 5-star rating puts it in the top tier of all eligible hospitals in the United States, with respect to patient safety and the overall patient experience. Out of 4,654 hospitals in the nation that were eligible for a CMS star rating in 2023, only 483 received a 5-star rating (15%). LMH is one of only 14 hospitals in the state of Indiana to receive this prestigious distinction.

"As a community hospital, we believe it is so important that patients have the best experience possible while in our care," says Tara McVay, Chief Nursing Officer for Logansport Memorial Hospital. "When a patient comes through our doors, they trust us to bring them the most caring, dedicated clinical expertise that we have. Our entire team of providers and staff are committed to a culture of safety and transparency that has led to this remarkable achievement. We have worked to encourage and empower our employees to speak up if they see something that could lead to a patient harm or a poor outcome. We strive for perfection, but also believe that our processes and quality of care get better by recognizing that there is always room for improvement. It takes our entire team working together to make that happen, and this star rating undoubtedly highlights and celebrates our commitment to high-quality, highly reliable healthcare right here at home."

Emilee Albright, Director of Quality and Population Health, added, "Our quality model is a collaborative, integrated approach that annually prioritizes objectives and measures focused on patient safety and continuous improvement. Every patient encounter is an opportunity for timeliness and exceptional service, whether it is within our hospital walls or out in the community as we connect them to the care they need. Our focus on population health and impacting the social determinants of health by working in partnership with our patients has also directly impacted our quality scores. We are gaining a better understanding of their entire picture of health and what contributes to their health status as we provide the care they need, when and where they need it."

"I am tremendously proud of this star rating achievement for our hospital," comments David Ameen, interim President and CEO for Logansport Memorial Hospital. "The recognition for the exceptional levels of care provided here goes entirely to our clinical staff – the providers, nurses, techs, and all team members. I have always known and believed that the quality care that LMH is able to provide is of the highest levels. This star rating not only proves that, it celebrates it in a distinctive way. I am delighted to see that the hard work and commitment of our entire team has been recognized as being among our nation's best."

TARA MCVAY NAMED CEO FOR LOGANSPORT MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

The Board of Trustees is pleased to announce that Tara P. McVay, RN, MSN, CNO, has been appointed as the President/CEO of Logansport Memorial Hospital effective August 7, 2023. Official action was taken at a special session of the LMH Board of Trustees meeting on August 1, 2023.

The board chose McVay following a search that gave consideration to more than 30 candidates. She will be the first female president in the nearly 100-year history of the organization.

"I am happy to announce that Tara has accepted the position as President/CEO. Through our search and interview process, I've learned that Tara possesses a deep respect for the Logansport Memorial mission and team, a heart for healthcare, and for the people and communities we are privileged to serve," said Scott Stebbins, chair of the Logansport Memorial Hospital Board of Trustees. "I also want to thank David Ameen as our interim CEO for the past four months, the CEO search committee, and every team member for their commitment to caring for our patients and serving our community."

McVay joined Logansport Memorial Hospital in 1997 and has served in a variety of nursing roles throughout the organization. She joined the Executive Leadership team in 2013 and was named as the Chief Nursing Officer in 2015. Throughout her career, she has focused on quality, achieving the CMS 5-Star designation; strategy development leading to increased retention and recruitment in the nursing areas; as well as partnerships with local universities to provide opportunities for professional growth of the workforce.

"I am honored and humbled by the opportunity to lead a place and a group of people that have meant so much to me for the last twenty-six years," said McVay. "I look

forward to collaborating closely with LMH's dedicated and talented providers, nurses, and staff to ensure a high-quality and rewarding health care experience for all patients."

McVay holds a Master of Science in Nursing Leadership and Management from Western Governors University and a Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Purdue University. She serves as the chairman of the West Central Indiana Patient Safety Coalition and is a member of the Midwest Indiana Organization of Nursing Leaders. She also serves on the 4C Board of Directors, as well as holds a seat on the Indiana University Kokomo and Ivy Tech Advisory Boards. She and her husband Randy reside in Miami County and have two children.



RUSH MEMORIAL HOSPITAL EXPANDS BEHAVIORAL AND MENTAL HEALTH

"After tripling in size over the last 12 months, the RMH Behavioral and Mental Health Department has undergone many changes. The most noticeable change has been the space crunch created by staff expansion. In order to accommodate this expansion, the hospital purchased and remodeled the new "RMH Healthcare Solutions" building, located at 1264 IN-3, Rushville, IN 46173. Patients will be seen in the new building starting on August 14, 2023.

Thanks to the expansion, the hospital has also been able to add four new support groups. These groups offer: support for those suffering from suicidal ideation, support for those who have suffered from a loss due to suicide, support for those caring for a loved one who suffers from suicidal ideation and support for those who suffer from anxiety and/or depression.

Of course, the core work of this department is behavioral and mental health counseling and medication management. The biggest benefit of recent growth has been the hospital's increased capacity to meet the needs of our community with regard to these crucial services."



NEW TRAINING PROGRAM AT RUSH MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

"Rush Memorial Hospital has recently created a new program for training Medical Laboratory Technicians (MLT's). This program is being offered in partnership with Weber State University. Successful applicants will complete a two-and-a-half-year course of studies in a hybrid program combining online coursework with in-person

clinical experience. Graduates will receive a degree in Applied Science. Both employees and members of the public are welcome to apply.

In order to help students succeed, RMH will provide dual mentorship in classwork and clinical training. When not completing coursework, students will work with RMH Phlebotomists. On September 6 the RMH Laboratory will hold an open house for prospective applicants. This will give interested parties an opportunity to see the lab and question the MLT staff about real-world job experience.

Tuition for this program will be free for the first two MLT students. Fees will be paid by the RMH Hospital Foundation with funds raised through the 2023 and 2024 RMH Hospital Foundation Golf Outings. The Foundation will also cover tuition for four students in the Certified Clinical Medical Technician Program. This program will be launching its third round of classes on September 18, 2023."
