

ENDING THE STIGMA

Those with Substance Use Disorder (SUD) and other related conditions face discrimination and stigma when seeking treatment. The Indiana Rural Opioid Consortium (InROC) wants to change that.



PREVENTION

Reduce morbidity and mortality associated with SUD by advocating for and participating in prevention activities



TREATMENT

Expand access to treatment options, with a focus on providing evidence-based Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT)



RECOVERY

Promote access to recovery options and expand recovery efforts in rural communities throughout our service area



TAKING ACTION

The Indiana Rural Opioid Consortium (InROC) was established in October 2017 with partners across the state, working together to fight the opioid crisis in Indiana, which has seen a staggering 86.9% increase in opioid overdose from 2010 to 2015.

InROC also looks beyond the focus of Opioid Use Disorder and looks to address all Substance Use Disorders. While PHASE 1 of this project focuses on prevention, education, and outreach, PHASE 2 aims to address prevention, treatment, and recovery for not only opioid use disorder but also substance use disorder and infectious diseases like hepatitis C and HIV.

OUR GOALS

01

Reduce the occurrence and associated risk of SUD among new and at-risk users, including fatal opioid-related overdoses, and increased infectious disease detection.

02

Expand access to evidence-based practices, especially Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) with psychosocial intervention, for all rural Indiana citizens.

03

Expand access to recovery and treatment options for individuals battling OUD.



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
